## 1. Crime and Patrol Summary

See attachments. The department responded to 1,286 requests for service during the month of August. Community Service responded to 170 requests for service.

School is back in session and we have focused patrols in the school zones. The first few days of school at the Middle School and Sandrock Elementary were congested with traffic. Officers ended up directing traffic the first two days of school. Each day of the first week of school, the flow of traffic continued to improve.

This month we continued to handle several theft complaints. Most of the thefts were from vehicles and shoplifting.

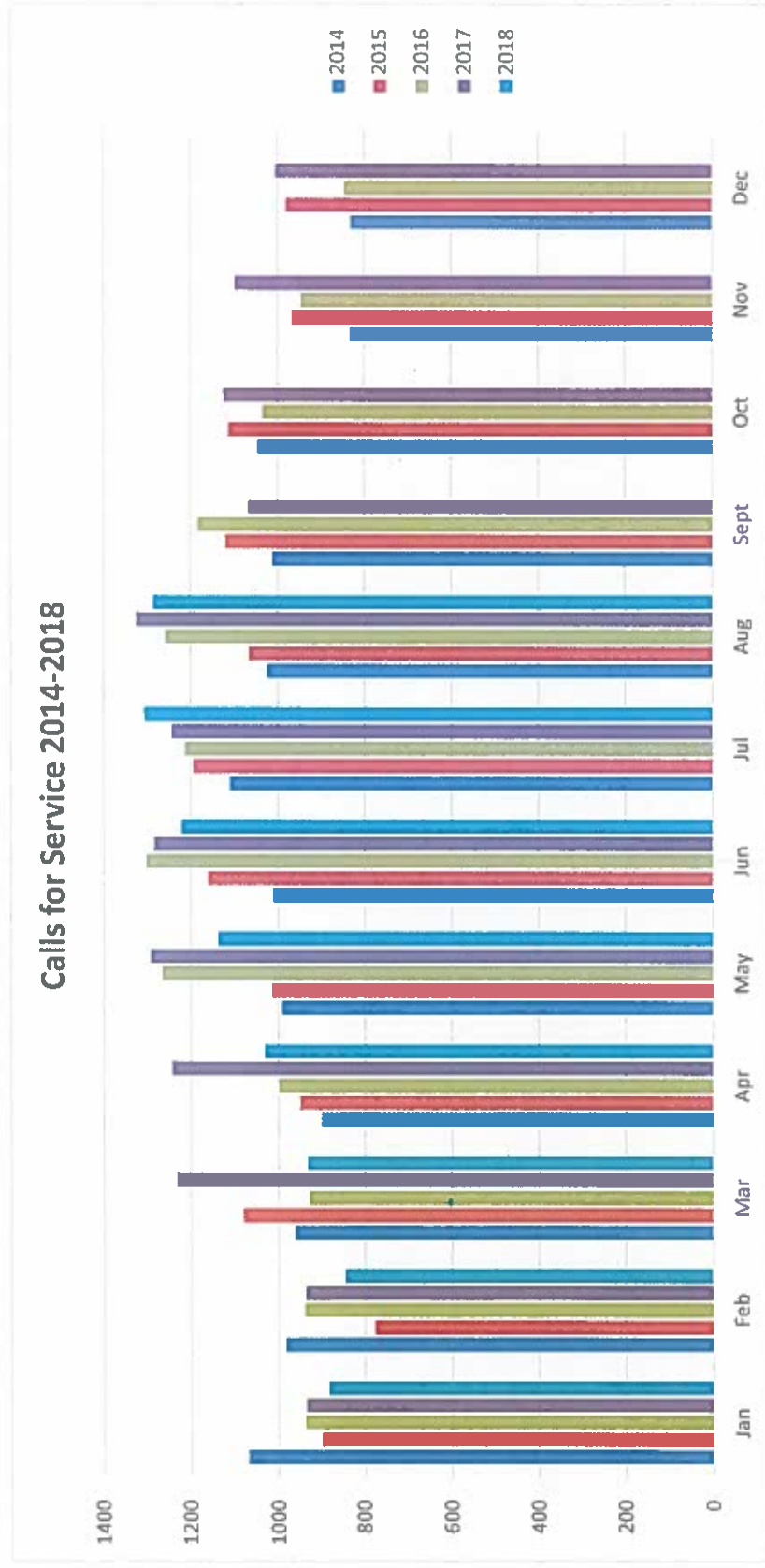
