## 1. *Crime and Patrol Summary*

*See attachments. The department responded to 1,123 requests for service during the month of October. Community Service responded to 173 requests for service.*

*This month, we handled a call that resulted in the death of a male. The specifics of the death were published in the paper and we are limited on what can be released. What I can tell you is when we have a crime of this magnitude, it is very time consuming for the responding officers and also the investigators.*

*The trend continues with possession of illegal drugs. This month, several more individuals were charged with possession of Schedule I or II drugs. Most of these charges start with a contact of an individual; and during the contact, the illegal drugs are located.*

*In last month's report, I reported on the stolen vehicles a person was arrested for, along with other charges. This month, the same person was at a party. He obtained the keys (unlawfully) for a vehicle and took off in the vehicle without the owner's permission. The vehicle was later located with the suspect still in the vehicle. The suspect was charged accordingly.*

Officer Fritz and Investigator Rimmer continue to teach DARE for Sandrock Elementary, Ridgeview Elementary and the students of the Shared School Homeschool group.

Officer Fritz was involved in the following activities for month.

- Attended several events and meetings including Substance Abuse Prevention Program Board meeting, multiple MCHS and CMS sporting events, the Moffat County Youth Advisory Council Meeting, the Events Committee (CPD/MCSO joint committee)
- Continued investigations on reports taken over the summer
- Attended the Juvenile Services Planning Commission meeting in Steamboat (Appointed to the Commission by Judge O'Hara)
- PoliceOne online training and Daily Training Bulletins
- On-Call as investigator for 1 week
- Boys and Girls Club Outreach. Spent time with students there.
- DV/SART Review
- Follow-up on Katrina Treacy runaway case with Commerce City PD and Aurora PD
- Substitute (guest teacher) ALICE training
- Continue to work with the Teen Club at Boys and Girls Club. They are working on a Social Change Project involving Teen Tobacco Prevention.
- Child Protection Team monthly meeting
- Night Range Training (low light identification of targets)
- Building a Better You, attended planning meeting
- This group, headed by Dr. Sullivan will be teaching a new sex education curriculum for Middle and High School students. They asked for my participation due to my relationship with the schools/students.

### Elementary School Activities

- Unfortunately, as a single SRO, it has already proven difficult to do much proactive policing at the elementary level.
- Sunset Elementary, report of suspicious male on the campus. This was after hours, possibly a homeless person living on the campus at night, extra patrols set up for the school.

- *Sunset Elementary, worked on a plan for a special needs student afraid of police, then started implementing that plan.*
- *Sandrock Elementary, worked with Principal on bullying report received in my DARE box.*
- *Sunset Elementary, conducted a welfare check on a family with a kindergarten and first grade student who stopped attending. They moved without telling the school - high risk family.*
- *Sandrock Elementary, welfare check on student who stopped coming to school. The student had no clothing and was in need. I assisted the Principal in finding resources for the student/parent. He has since returned to school and is missing almost no time.*
- *East Elementary, civil issues with truancy.*
- *Sandrock Elementary, truancy meeting with staff, student, parent - high risk family*
- *Sandrock Elementary, spoke to staff member about a possible report of abuse.*
- *Sunset Elementary, assisted patrol by going to the school and staying with a student whose parents had been detained on a traffic stop and subsequent vehicle search.*
- *East Elementary, civil protection order issue.*

### *CMS Activities*

- *Investigated harassment with two students that was occurring off-campus.*
- *Lots of follow-up on Sexting/Harassment cases.*
- *Welfare check on truant student.*
- *Investigated a report of an on-bus fight possibly involving a knife. No charges will be filed.*
- *Follow-up on reported Sexual Assault.*
- *Attended VRT (Violence Risk Team) meeting for 8<sup>th</sup> grade student suspended the week prior.*
- *Responded to an EMS call at the school, student injured as a result of a shoving match, no charges as was a mutual combatant situation.*

- *Harassment issue, student warned about asking the same girl on dates after she told him no.*
- *Student reported possible abuse to me. Assisted Patrol Officer with investigation*
- *Follow-up welfare check on previous report of abuse*

- Took a report of a cellular phone removed from a Para's purse in the classroom

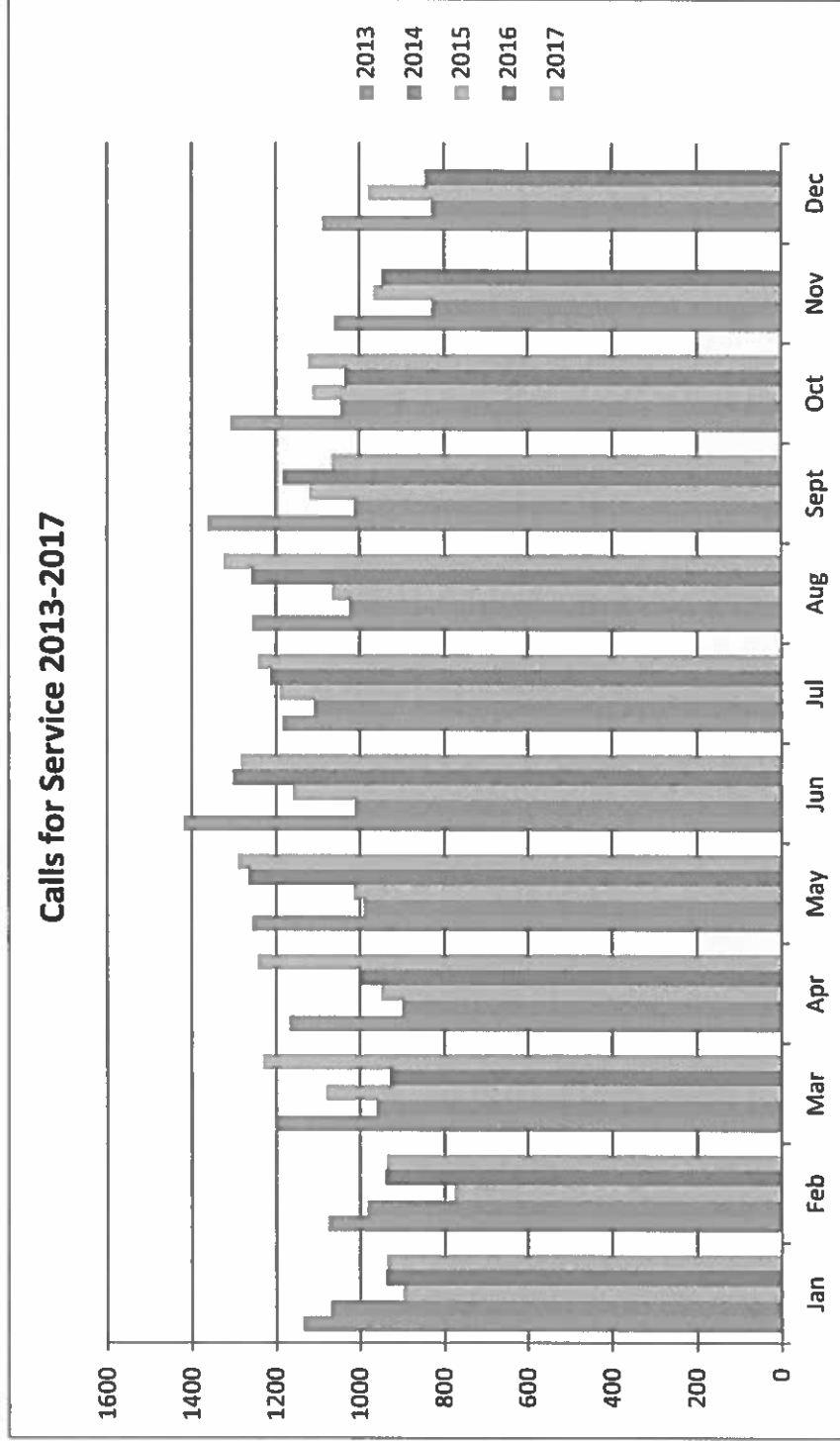
